Dear Dr. Melde.

I saw Mr. Herr in the office today for a complaint of some abdominal pain.

SUBJECTIVELY: He states he has had influenza recently and has had coughing paroxysms. He coughs so much that he started to develop abdominal pain and experienced severe pain in the region of his biliary tract surgery. He had some problems with a bile leak and also had pancreatitis following an ERCP where a stent was placed. He seems to have no severe pain today. There is perhaps some soreness.

OBJECTIVELY: On physical examination today, I find a 39-year-old male who has gained some weight since his last visit. In fact, it would appear he has gained 25 lbs. Blood pressure 138/100. Abdomen shows scars from his recent surgery. He has normal bowel sounds. We find no peritoneal signs at all. There does not really seem to be any tenderness on palpation at all.

PLAN: I have told him that he could expect to have some tenderness due to the abdominal adhesions, which would have developed following surgery and any irritation from a bile leak. Unfortunately, these will be present the rest of his life, and the only way to remove them would be surgery, but in his case, I advised him to avoid surgery at all costs.
